**COUNTY SEAT: ASOTIN**

**Name derived from "Ha-Shu-tin", the Nez Perce Indian name for Asotin Creek, translated as "eel stream"**

**Traditional home of Nez Perce American Indian people**

Bordered by Oregon on the south and Idaho on the east, Asotin County lies in the extreme southeast corner of Washington. The Snake River cuts a canyon nearly 2,000 feet deep along its eastern side. Outside settlers started arriving during the 1860s, spurred by a gold rush in Idaho. But pioneer farmers soon found greater fortune in raising beef cattle and wheat.

*NAME DERIVED FROM "HA-SHU-TIN", THE NEZ PERCE INDIAN NAME FOR ASOTIN CREEK, TRANSLATED AS "EEL STREAM"*

*TRADITIONAL HOME OF NEZ PERCE AMERICAN INDIAN PEOPLE*

*BORDERED BY OREGON ON THE SOUTH AND IDAHO ON THE EAST, ASOTIN COUNTY LIES IN THE EXTREME SOUTHEAST CORNER OF WASHINGTON. THE SNAKE RIVER CUTS A CANYON NEARLY 2,000 FEET DEEP ALONG ITS EASTERN SIDE. OUTSIDE SETTLERS STARTED ARRIVING DURING THE 1860S, SPURRED BY A GOLD RUSH IN IDAHO. BUT PIONEER FARMERS SOON FOUND GREATER FORTUNE IN RAISING BEEF CATTLE AND WHEAT.*
