**Traditional home of Hoh, Jamestown S'Klallam, Lower Elwha Klallam,  
Makah, Quileute and Quinault American Indian people**

Clallam County is located in the farthest northwest corner of the continental United States, framed by the Strait of Juan de Fuca and the great Pacific Ocean. It is a land wild coastline, deep forest and rugged Olympic Mountains that rise up to 8,000 feet high. Because of its geographic isolation, this region is home to animal species – Olympic marmot, Crescenti trout and magnificent Roosevelt Elk – native to no other part of the world.

*CLALLAM COUNTY IS LOCATED IN THE FARTHEST NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE  
CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES, FRAMED BY THE STRAIT OF JUAN DE FUCA AND THE  
GREAT PACIFIC OCEAN. IT IS A LAND OF WILD COASTLINE, DEEP FOREST AND RUGGED  
OLYMPIC MOUNTAINS THAT RISE UP TO 8,000 FEET HIGH. BECAUSE OF ITS GEOGRAPHIC  
ISOLATION, THIS REGION IS HOME TO ANIMAL SPECIES - OLYMPIC MARMOT, CRESCENT  
TROUT AND MAGNIFICENT ROOSEVELT ELK - NATIVE TO NO OTHER PART OF THE WORLD.*
