COUNTY SEAT: POMEROY

Named for James A. Garfield, 20th President of the United States, in the year he was assassinated

Traditional hunting and gathering grounds of Nez Perce American Indian people

Garfield County, a land of farm fields and pastures, is bounded on the north by the scenic Snake River and on the south by the wild Blue Mountains. Explorers Lewis and Clark passed through here on their homeward journey in 1806, traveling along an American Indian route known as the Nez Perce Trail. Heated disagreement in the county's early days over which town should serve as county seat was resolved by an unusual Act of Congress that gave the honor to Pomeroy.

TRADITIONAL HUNTING AND GATHERING GROUNDS OF NEZ PERCE NAMED FOR JAMES A. GARFIELD, 20TH PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, IN THE YEAR HE WAS ASSASSINATED AMERICAN INDIAN PEOPLE

GARFIELD COUNTY, A LAND OF FARM FIELDS AND PASTURES, IS BOUNDED ON THE NORTH EXPLORERS LEWIS AND CLARK PASSED THROUGH HERE ON THEIR HOMEWARD JOURNEY IN 1806, TRAVELING ALONG AN AMERICAN INDIAN ROUTE KNOWN AS THE NEZ PERCE TRAIL. HEATED DISAGREEMENT IN THE COUNTY'S EARLY DAYS OVER WHICH TOWN BY THE SCENIC SNAKE RIVER AND ON THE SOUTH BY THE WILD BLUE MOUNTAINS. SHOULD SERVE AS COUNTY SEAT WAS RESOLVED BY AN UNUSUAL ACT OF CONGRESS THAT GAVE THE HONOR TO POMEROY.
