<a href="#">Chapter 200-200 WAC</a> State capitol grounds traffic and parking regulations	Amend rule to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Put in place a mechanism for quickly placing or modifying enforceable restrictions for vehicles parking on the Capitol Campus with a focus on Deschutes Parkway.</li> </ul>	Extensive stakeholder work has been done and more is planned. Completion of the stakeholder work has been delayed due to the impacts of the pandemic. Depending on how the pandemic situation evolves, we anticipate filing proposed rules (CR-102) in late 2020.
<a href="#">Chapter 200-110 WAC</a> Self-insurance requirements as to local governments	Expedited rulemaking in order to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Reflect transition of health care benefits for schools to the Health Care Authority.</li> </ul>	While work was paused due to the impacts of the pandemic, work has re-started. We intend to file an Expedited Rule Making CR-105. We anticipate filing before the end of July.
<a href="#">Chapter 200-100 WAC</a> Self-insurance requirements as to local governments	Amend rule to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Allow the <a href="#">Pilotage Commission</a> to self-insure through the local government risk pool. This change is restricted to liability coverage only.</li> <li>Provide improved understanding of the rules relative to reserve levels. This change will not change Cr-101 rule requirements.</li> </ul>	While work was paused due to the impacts of the pandemic, work has re-started. We anticipate filing a Pre-Notice of Inquiry (CR-101) before the end of July.
<a href="#">WAC 200-300-085</a> Bid award preference	Amend rule to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Align with the current state perspective on acquisition of goods with recycled content.</li> </ul>	Some stakeholder work has been done and more is planned. Completion of the stakeholder work has been slowed due to the impacts of the pandemic. Depending on how the pandemic situation evolves, we anticipate filing proposed rules (CR-102) in late summer of 2020.
