Other content changes align the rules with recent changes to other self-insurance rules addressing purchasing requirements and independent audit requirements Reasons supporting proposal: The Office of Risk Management is the regulator for local government risk pools. In 2019, the legislature passed HB 1431 Concerning joint self-insurance programs for property and liability. This bill amends state law under RCW 48.62 to allow the State Board of Pilotage Commissioners (the Board), a Washington State agency, to participate in a local government joint self-insurance program covering liability risks. Previously, no state agency was allowed to join a local government self-insurance pool. Page 1 of 3

During review of the current rules, it became clear that other language may need to be amended to align with the statute to accommodate a state agency such as the Board. Some language applicable to local government members of a self-insurance pool does not necessarily apply to the Board.
