## RE: Edmonds School District GC/CM Re-Certification

Dear Members of the Project Review Committee,

I am writing this letter in recommendation of the Edmonds School District's pursuit for GC/CM alternative contracting recertification. As background, Spee West Construction Co. is a locally owned and operated general contractor specializing in PK-12 facility construction. Since incorporation in 1990, we have worked with over 30 public entities in the greater Puget Sound area and completed nearly 50 PK-12 projects.
