
SOLE SOURCE LAW CHANGES



Effective June 5, 2024

RCW 39.26.010 (23) a contractor providing goods or services of such a unique nature or sole availability at the location required that the contractor is clearly and justifiably the only practicable source to provide the goods or services.

RCW 39.26.140 (1) "Agencies must submit sole source contracts to the department and make the contracts available for public inspection not less than <u>fifteen</u> ten working days before the proposed starting date of the contract. ..."



TRANSPARENCY - WEBS



POLICY:	PROCEDURE:
Section 3	Presentation of Sole Source Contract Filing to DES
"selecting at a minimum all applicable commodity codes used by the prospective vendor"	"The name of the prospective sole source vendor, which must be registered in WEBS"

EXEMPTIONS

Sole source contracts

- Clarified exemption 1)
- Deleted exemption 2) now included in 1)
- Clarified exemption 10), to align with the statute, RCW 39.26.125.
 - 10) Contracts related to collaborative research
 - 9) Contracts for services that are necessary for conducting collaborative research if the use of a specific contractor is mandated by the funding source as a condition of granting funds;

SECTION 5. EXEMPTIONS, 13)

Sole source contracts

• Clarified previous exemptions 13), 14), and 15) as follows:

13)12) Professional development for state and/or higher education employees obtained from a third party, such as conferences, seminars, professional licenses, professional organization memberships, and professional publications. (See Glossary Supplement)

SECTION 5. EXEMPTIONS, 14)

Sole source contracts

• Clarified previous exemptions 13), 14), and 15) as follows:

13)12) Professional development for state and/or higher education employees obtained from a third party, such as conferences, seminars, professional licenses, professional organization memberships, and professional publications. (See Glossary Supplement)

14)13) Replacement or repair of rental equipment when required by the rental contractor under the rental agreement.

SECTION 5. EXEMPTIONS, 15)

• Clarified previous exemptions 13), 14), and 15) as follows:

13)12) Professional development for state and/or higher education employees obtained from a third party, such as conferences, seminars, professional licenses, professional organization memberships, and professional publications. (See Glossary Supplement)

14)13) Replacement or repair of rental equipment when required by the rental <u>contractor</u> <u>under the rental</u> agreement.

16)15) Contracts awarded by institutions of higher education from non-state funds only when the non-state funds account for 51% or greater of the total contract consideration.

NEW PROPOSED EXEMPTION



19) Goods and/or services when the providing entity has a copyright, trademark, or proprietary documents/data and there is no authorized reseller(s) or comparable good/service as documented through market research.

FILING EXEMPTIONS IN THE SSCD

FILING EXEMPTIONS PURPOSE

- Purpose of this change:
 - Record keeping
 - Improve oversight
- Compliance will be reviewed during the procurement risk assessment.

COMPLIANCE WITH WATECH POLICIES

Sole source contracts

7. Information Technology contracts.

All information technology (IT) related sole source contracts must also conform to all applicable Washington Technology Solutions (WaTech) policies. OCIO Policy #121. Agencies should confer with WaTech the **OCIO** as outlined in policy. Similarly, DES will be available to answer the agencies' IT sole source contract questions.



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MARKET RESEARCH

• New policy section 10


- Requires sufficient market research prior to filing in the SSCD
- Required for amendment filings

CAPABILITY STATEMENTS

- New policy section 11
- Requires agencies submit capability statement documents to SSCD/DES for review:
 - Documents
 - Correspondence
 - Agency analysis/conclusion



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SUPPLIER DIVERSITY

Sole source contracts

- New policy section 12
- Alignment with the Supplier Diversity Policy
- New/revised SSCD justification questions



DELEGATED AUTHORITY



POLICY:

9. Delegated Authority.


When filing in SSCD, agency will certify that it has (or will obtain) sufficient delegated authority, as defined in DES-POL-090, Delegation of Authority Policy.

PROCEDURES:

2. Confirms that the agency has sufficient delegated authority for the proposed purchase (**see procedure PRO-DES-090-00A for how to obtain additional delegated authority if applicable*).

NEW SOLE SOURCE PROCEDURES

- Conducting market research
- Responding to vendor capability statement(s)
- Requirements if the sole source request is for a convenience contract
- □ Filing **Exemption(s)** to the SSCD
